

BACKGROUND

The first Bagamati Province Youth Conference was held in Hetauda, the provincial capital, on the 11th and 12th of Ashar 2080. Government Ownership of Conference Declaration



Conclusion



Cyber Crime Investigation Bureau: Shared real-life examples of digital crimes and discussed the challenges faced in investigating and prosecuting such offenses.


Conclusion


- Sujal Bam: An artist with different abilities, recognized for his exceptional talent and creativity.

- Youth Entrepreneurship: Connect educational institutions with production by initiating a program in all 7031 public schools in the province to promote entrepreneurship.
- Youth Skills Development: Teach life skills and formulate policies for age-targeted skills and jobs through the provincial youth council and relevant ministries.
- Youth-Friendly Business Environment: Create a business-friendly environment for youth by ensuring easy access to loans, market assurance, and sustainable entrepreneurship.
- Volunteerism: Encourage youth to work as volunteers for at least 3 months in their interest area after formal study to develop a sense of responsible citizenship.
- Youth Participation in Planning: Ensure youth participation and involvement in development projects by making the planning process youth-friendly.
- Information Technology Literacy: Conduct campaigns on safe and appropriate use of information technology and social media in all districts of the province.
- 10. Youth Innovation and Entrepreneurship: Support youth innovation and entrepreneurship by simplifying legal processes and providing state support.
- 11. Environmental Protection: Increase youth participation in environmental protection by advocating for discussions on climate change and pollution.



Commitment to Implementation:

Minister of Social Development of Bagmati Province, Kumari Muktan, expressed full commitment to implementing the points of the manifesto, ensuring that the issues raised by the youth conference are addressed effectively.
